

MINISTER'S ORDER

**Designation of Prohibited, Noxious and Nuisance Weeds in Accordance with
*The Weed Control Act***

I, Daryl Harrison, Minister of Agriculture, pursuant to section 2(w, r and s) of *The Weed Control Act*, do hereby order that the plants under Schedule I of the Appendix be designated as Prohibited Weeds; and that those plants under Schedule II of the Appendix, be designated Noxious Weeds; and that those plants under Schedule III of the Appendix, be designated as Nuisance Weeds.
